On February 21, in Beijing, China National Heavy Machinery Corporation (CHMC), a subsidiary of Sinomach Heavy Equipment Group Co., Ltd. (Sinomach-HE), signed the implementation agreement, land lease agreement, and pumped storage agreement for the BOT (Build-Operate-Transfer) project of the Stung.

According to TrendForce, Cambodia is accelerating the development of clean energy to reduce its reliance on imported energy, enhance the country's energy security, ensure reliable and affordable power supply, and help this Southeast Asian nation achieve its goal of having at least 70% clean energy.

PHNOM PENH: The Cambodian government on Friday (Sept 27) approved 23 power investment projects totally worth US\$5.79 billion for 2024-2029, aiming at addressing the shortage of energy sources, said a press release. The approval was made during a weekly cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Hun. What is Cambodia upper Tatay hydropower station?

Rattanak said the Cambodia Upper Tatay Hydropower Station was the second project developed by the CHMC after the company invested in the development of a 246-MW Cambodia Tatay Hydropower Station here in 2010, in a 42-year BOT mode. The first project was put into operation in 2015 and has generated 858 million kilowatt-hours of electricity per year.

What if Cambodia had a power plant?

If it were functional today, the Electricity Authority of Cambodia (EAC) estimates the facility would account for 18% of the country's total generation capacity and produce 26% of the nation's energy output. "Royal Group's power plant is also noteworthy for being Cambodia's first gas-fired power plant," added Pianka.

Will Cambodia build new coal power plants?

According to the Khmer Times, Minister of Mines and Energy Suy Sem reiterated during a lecture on "Cambodia's Energy Policy" at the Royal University of Phnom Penh on the 4th that the country will not build new coal power plants in the future. He also stated that Cambodia has publicly committed to not building hydropower dams on the Mekong River.

What is Cambodia's largest power plant?

The gas-fired power plant will feature two combined cycle F-class generation units, each with a capacity of 450MW, making it Cambodia's largest power project to date. Commercial operation of the first unit is expected by April 2027.

Where is Cambodia's first gas-fired plant located?

The groundbreaking ceremony, hosted by the Royal Group of Companies, unveiled the country's first-ever gas-fired plant, located in Thmor Sor commune, Botum Sakor district. The project is part of Cambodia's fast-track

energy initiatives, approved by the government in late September, and is fully owned by the Royal Group.
