# Iceland does not use base stations for communication

Naval Air Station Keflavik (NASKEF) was a United States Navy air station at Keflavík International Airport, Iceland, located on the Reykjanes peninsula on the south-west portion of the island. NASKEF was closed on 8 September 2006 and its facilities were taken over by the Icelandic Defence Agency as their primary base (from 2011 the agency was handed over to the Icelandic Coast Guard). History After being granted self-governance by in 1918 with the signing of the 25-year .

Naval Air Station Keflavik was the host command for all U.S. defense activities in Iceland. The major commands stationed on the base were the USAF's 85th Group, Fleet Air Keflavik, the headquarters of the U.S.-provid.

What does the Icelandic Coast Guard do?

The Icelandic Coast Guard is responsible for operational defence tasks in Iceland including but not limited to operation of NATO – Keflavik Air Base, Security Zones, Iceland Air Defence Systems,, its remote radar and communication sites, including Communication and Information Systems.

Does the US have a military presence in Iceland?

However, this doesn't paint the full picture. The United States maintains a strong military presence in Iceland through bilateral agreements and rotational deployments, leveraging the strategically important Keflavík Naval Air Station for various operational needs.

Are there US military bases in Iceland?

The short answer is no, there are no permanent, active US military bases currently stationed in Iceland. However, this doesn't paint the full picture.
