# Ukrainian energy storage project battery manufacturer



## Overview

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Ukrainian private utility DTEK has energised the largest battery storage project in the war-torn country and one of the biggest ones in Eastern Europe. The 200 MW/400 MWh installation spans six sites ranging from 20 MW to 50 MW and connected to the power grid in the Kyiv and Dnipropetrovsk regions.

Ukraine's biggest private energy firm, DTEK, has launched a major battery storage facility that will bring power to hundreds of thousands of homes and strengthen the grid ahead of expected Russian attacks this winter, the company said. DTEK partnered with American energy firm Fluence Energy Inc. —.

The batteries will be spread out over six plants, helping enhance grid stability and energy independence within Ukraine, which has been at war since Russia invaded more than two years ago. Ukrainian private energy developer DTEK has selected U.S.-based battery storage supplier Fluence Energy B.V.

Fluence and DTEK complete Ukraine's largest battery storage project, enhancing energy stability with a capacity of 200 MW. Fluence Energy, in partnership with DTEK Group, has successfully completed Ukraine's largest battery-based energy storage project, with a capacity of 200 MW, in under six.

- Six BESS projects (20MW-50MW each, 2-hour duration) now in commissioning phase
- Uses Fluence's Gridstack technology, with commercial operations set for October 2025
- First fully remote commissioning due to wartime constraints, with Ukrainian engineers trained in Europe

Why is DTEK launching a battery storage facility in Ukraine?

How important are energy storage systems in Ukraine?

"In the context of large-scale attacks on Ukraine's energy system, the role of energy storage systems has become just as fundamental as energy generation itself," said energy minister Svitlana Grinchuk. (\$1 = 0.8554 euros).

Why is DTEK investing in Ukraine?

"Despite the war, we invest in Ukraine's recovery and growth. Our energy sector, having withstood countless Russian attacks, now gains new momentum," owner of DTEK and Ukraine's richest man, Rinat Akhmetov, said in a press release.

How much did DTEK invest in a battery storage system?

DTEK said its total investment in the project amounted to 125 million euros (\$146.13 million). Six battery storage systems have been connected to the power grid in the capital Kyiv and Dnipropetrovsk regions in eastern Ukraine, it said.

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
